POST SURGEON

Comrades and Sisters, the Post and Pup Tent 9 have been busy supporting our Veterans through our active hospital programs and individual assistance to veterans and their families.

During the months of January and February, ninety-four VFW/LAUX, and Cooties, participated in twenty-seven projects that benefited 345 VA Hospital patients and Veterans in need of assistance. These volunteers travelled a combined total of 2,697 miles at their own expense, and donated \$3,323 in time and service.

These projects included taking Veterans to doctor's appointments, visiting Veterans in the hospital and at home, and taking Veterans to the Veterans Administration Hospital.

In January, 105 hospitalized

Veterans at the VA Medical Center Hampton, received gifts through the 'Christmas in January' project. This was in addition to the popular Movie, popcorn and Pizza program that provides a break from hospital routine for the patients. In February, the same group of volunteers did Bingo at the hospital.

Since 1998, the National Comprehensive Cancer Control Program (NCCCP) has made great strides to reduce the burden of cancer in the United States. The program assess the burden of cancer, determine priorities, and develop and implement cancer plans. Comprehensive cancer control (CCC) programs across the nation are working in their communities to promote healthy lifestyles and recommended cancer screenings, educate people about cancer symptoms, increase access to quality cancer care, and enhance cancer survivors' quality of life.

Ongoing work, the program continues to:

- Support and promote interventions that address cancer disparities
- Offer ongoing technical assistance to programs that are developing and implementing CCC plans
- Support partnerships that strengthen cancer control at the national, state, and local levels
- Conduct public health translational research to inform program practice
- Broaden awareness of the CCC concept and its benefits
- Facilitate networking and peer-to-peer learning among the NCCCP's 65 programs
- Disseminate best practices and evidence-based strategies

These steps help support the best in partnership, program evaluation, and cancer control practice for improving the health of people in every stage of life - one of CDC's primary health protection goals.
