POST SURGEON

Comrades and Sisters, our Members have been busy supporting our Veterans through our active hospital programs and individual assistance to veterans and their families. During the month of June, ninety four VFW/LAUX, and Cooties, participated in nine projects that benefited 10 VA Hospital patients and Veterans in need of assistance. These volunteers travelled a combined total of 306 miles at their own expense, with a valuation of over \$40 in time and service.

Congratulations are in order regarding our hospital volunteer's tremendous accomplishment in winning the William T. Allen Hospital Award for Hospital services provided in 2013 – 2014. This prestigious award was presented during our July Post meeting by VFW VA District 2 Commander Pete Gebelein.

Advances in VA Healthcare access: The Department of Defense, in collaboration with the Departments of Veterans Affairs and Labor, have integrated the National Resource Directory (NRD) into eBenefits to improve access to health care, benefits information and more at <https://www.ebenefits.va.gov/ebenefits/nrd>. After registering for website, Service Members, Veterans, families and caregivers can now find enhanced self-service capabilities and resources from one site.

New prescription policy: As of July 1st, military pharmacies around the country implemented a new policy to accept prescription transfers from other military and civilian pharmacies. This policy is

one of the first initiatives developed by the Defense Health Agency in conjunction with the military surgeons general. This standard prescription transfer process for all military pharmacies ensures patients can move their prescriptions to a new facility without getting a new prescription from their provider.

In closing, the hospital related volunteer work that you have been doing for our fellow Veterans is simply outstanding! Even with that being said, there remain a staggering number of Vets in the local area that we are currently unable to help due our volunteer's being stretched so thin. I encourage you to help them out by either becoming a hospital volunteer yourself, or by sending me your ideas for increasing our Veteran's health community outreach activities.

**CANCER AID
AND RESEARCH**

**FINDING SUPPORT
PROGRAMS AND SERVICES**

(excerpt from cancer.org Support & Treatment Resources)

The American Cancer Society has programs and services to help people with cancer and their loved ones to understand cancer, manage their lives through treatment and recovery, and find the emotional support they need. And best of all, it is free.

Online Communities & Support

If you're facing a cancer diagnosis, connecting with others

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the VFW main office for appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- (1) Signer must personally appear before the notary.
- (2) Signer (s) must positively be identified
- (3) Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be current, contain a photo and physical description of the card holder, have the card holder's signature, and a serial or ID number. For example:

- (1) Driver's license or State issued ID card.
- (2) U.S. Passport
- (3) Foreign Passport, validated by INS.
- (4) Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- (5) U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he/she suspects something may be false or wrong.

GETTING YOUR HOUSE IN ORDER

Have you done a legal tune-up lately?

So, how long since you've completed all your estate planning documents? When was the last time you read them? It's a good idea to review your documents at least every five years or upon an event that might require an edit of your documents (like your executor can no longer serve). First of all, locate your documents. If you can't find them, make an appointment with legal to re-do them. Second, read each document carefully. On your will, double check the names of beneficiaries; executors, etc. (Did your daughter get married since you wrote the last will?) or if you even made a will? Are the executors and trustees still the right people for the job? Do you still want the same distribution of your assets?

Review you living will and health care power of attorney. Are your wishes expressed in those documents still what you want? Are the agents you appointed still

the right people to make these decisions for you? Have their names or contacts information changed? If you have a durable financial power of attorney, are the agents you appointed still the right people to make these decisions for you? Have their names or contact information changed? Do you want to change what your agents can do for you if you become incapacitated?

If any of your documents need changes, contact legal for assistance in revising your documents. Active duty or retired service members and their ID card holding family members may be eligible for free legal assistance. For more information on modifying or updating your documents and/or to find a legal assistance office near you, call your nearest military installation JAG section.
