## WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT DEBT?

Note: Our present administration has put America in a large debt hole. Borrowing money from China, who also now has financial troubles? What happens when they demand payment? Also look at Greece and its financial troubles!

What about you individually?

Q: No one ever warned us about the dangers of debt, and after we got married we bought anything we wanted and simply put it on our credit cards. Now, we're up to our eyeballs in debt, and don't' see how we'll ever get out. Does the Bible say anything about debt?

A: Yes, it certainly does; the Bible repeatedly warns us about the dangers of debt and urges us not to allow ourselves to be overwhelmed by it, particularly when we have no realistic way to pay the money back. The Bible says, "Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another" (Romans 13:8) It's unfortunate that you individually and or both your wife didn't realize sooner how dangerous debt can be. Perhaps our schools need to do more to alert young people to this problem, particularly since credit cards and other ways to incur debt are so readily available today.

Debt never goes away; it either must be repaid, or a person ends up in bankruptcy, which (you must understand) creates a series of new problems (scorned, unable to further yourself because of bad credit or homeless). The Bible warns, "The borrower is a slave to the lender" (Proverbs 22:7).

But the deeper issue for you isn't economic but spiritual. Why did you spent so much? The reason is because you wanted more than you could afford, and you wanted those thing because you believed they'd bring you happiness. In other words, the desire for things took over your life. The Bible has a word for this: covetousness. Covetousness is a sin because it makes thing more important to us than God.

Seek advice from someone who can help you get a grip on your finances; your community may have agency or other service to help you. Then you will conquer your finances, and dedicate your whole lives to Christ and pray for help / guidance from God every day.

## <u>Notary Public</u>

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

Bob Duvall

• Joseph G. Brady

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the Post for an appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)
- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he /she suspects anything may be false or wrong.
