CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

DO YOU THINK ALLAH AND JESUS ARE THE SAME?

Because in Walton County, Georgia, people seems to think so. Do you think institutionalized education is headed down the wrong path? Let's tell the rest of the story!

Well, if you're a parent in Walton County, Ga. You now have one of the biggest reason to be upset in all the nation.

This is because the school district in this southern state has decided to implement teachings on Islam claiming Allah ... is the exact same God Christians and Jews worship. Not true, because Jesus was not about collecting harems of women and then making infidels die cruel deaths. We're starting to hear more and more stories about school kids bringing home assignments chock full of Islamic indoctrination, and it's certainly not going over well with the majority of parents across the country.

In it's defense of the assignments, the State Department of Education released a statement explaining that the "standard for seventh grade given to educators is to compare and contrast the prominent religions in the Middle East: Judaism, Islam, and Christianity."

It's frightening to think these are the kinds of teaching coming from our teaching establishment.

Pedagogic institutions don't need to be endorsing anything, but they certainly are when they malign truths about religions to make one more acceptable than the other. This is indoctrination plain and simple, the schools are becoming b r e e d i n g g r o u n d s o f misinformation. If not, then what other reason could they have to dedicate that much time to teachings on violent religion?

They have stopped our pledge allegiance to our flag of the United States of America and even prayer in the schools. If you pay-attention to the news - even our school sports coaches are being told no prayers to our youth before a sports event! Are we to become Godless like Europe in America?

NOTARY PUBLIC

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

- Bob Duvall
- Joseph G. Brady

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the Post for an appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)
- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada

• U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he / she suspects anything may be false or wrong.
