VA and Social Security Partner for Faster Service: The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and the Social Security Administration (SSA) launched a new Health IT initiative that enables VA to share medical records electronically with Social Security Disability processors.

This secure process will save time and money, resulting in better service for veterans and dependents who apply for Social Security Disability Benefits. For decades, SSA obtained medical records through a manual process. This new national initiative puts in place an automated process to obtain veterans' medical records entirely electronically.

"This SSA-VA partnership is another example of VA's leadership in interoperability efforts among federal partners," said VA Secretary, Robert McDonald. "Increasing federal partnerships to improve operation and resource coordination across agencies is among VA's 12 Breakthrough Priorities for 2016."

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the Post for an appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)
- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he /she suspects anything may be false or wrong.

DELIVERING THE HOLIDAYS TO MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS

US Postal Service Recommended Mailing dates

Ensuring those serving in the nation's armed forces and diplomatic service receive their presents, care packages and cards in time for the holidays is a priority for the USPS and for friends and family members of military and diplomatic personnel serving their country around the world.

To send packages to loved ones serving in the military abroad, the Postal Service offers a discounted price of \$16.75 on its largest Priority Mail Flat Rate Box. The price includes a \$2 per box discount for mail sent to APO/FPO (Air/Army Post Office/Fleet Post Office) destinations worldwide.

Priority Mail Flat Rate Boxes are available at no cost at local Post Offices and online at shop.usps.com. Postage, labels and customs forms can be printed online anytime using Click-N-Ship at usps.com/ship.

To ensure timely delivery of holiday wishes by Dec. 25, the USPS recommends that cards and packages be sent to military APO/FPO addresses overseas no later than the dates listed in the chart.

Please note that Priority Mail Express Military Service is available to selected military Post Offices. Check with your local Post Office to determine if this service is available to an APO/FPO address.

Parcel Airlift Mail (PAL) is a service that provides air transportation for parcels on a

space-available basis. PAL is available for Standard Post items not exceeding 30 pounds in weight or 60 inches in length and girth combined. The applicable PAL fee must be paid in addition to the regular surface price for each addressed piece sent by PAL service.

Please remember when packaging: Do not write the country name where the service member is stationed in the address, include a return address, and inside the box, include the service member's name and address as well as the sender's name and address on an index card in case the shipping label gets damaged in transit.
