SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen are all completed with the exception of the Awards. Our next Scholarship Programs are coming up quickly.

The Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award is the coming to a close next month. This is an award for exception teachers who teach Kindergarten up to 12 grade. If there is a teacher that you think deserves this award, please submit their name into this scholarship. We are trying to find teachers who possess the special skills and dedication to their students.

There are three areas to enter, grades K-5, 6-8 and 9-12. A teacher may be nominated by another teacher, principal, or a couple of students. The only exception is the person nominating a teacher cannot be a relative of the teacher.

A short 350 word essay on why the teacher should be selected is

required with the nominating brochure. So if you know any teacher who is worthy, please let me know provide the information to the nominator

It is also a good idea to let the teacher know that you are nominating someone since they will have to gather some items to be submitted (i.e.: one-page resume, up to five-pages of documentation of their teaching experience, references, news articles, etc., and a head and shoulder photo of themselves).

The deadline for nominations is February 15, 2017. Entries should be sent to VFW Post 392.

Scout of the Year Program is next on the agenda. This open to Boy Scouts who achieved their Eagle Award this year, Girl Scouts who earned their Gold Award, and Venturing Crew or Sea Scout who have earned their Venture Summit Award or Ouartermaster Award.

Applicant's ages 15 thru 18, in high school at the time of selection and who reach their 18th birthday will remain eligible during the nomination year if otherwise qualified.

These Scouts should have demonstrated exemplary citizenship in school, Scouting and community.

Deadline for entries is March 1. 2017. Again entries should be send to VFW Post 392. Α photograph of the Scout is necessary along with a one-page resume the candidate's high school activities including academic achievements, offices held, honors received, significant participation in other activities. Also Scouting record (maximum of 3 pages one side only) beginning with Cub Scouts o r Brownies, years

participation, unit numbers and sponsors. Also include when Summit. or Gold Eagle, Ouartermaster Award and Palms was received. Identify leadership positions held at all levels, participation in Scouting activities (Order of the Arrow, Jamborees, conferences, etc.) and the candidate's Eagle Scout, Girl Scout Gold Award, Venture Summit o r Sea Scout Quartermaster project. Community service record and three letters of recommendation from Scout Leader, Community Member and a teacher or faculty member or if homeschooled a parent letter is allowed (no more than two-pages in length).

Applicants may also include one or two additional letters (again two -pages in length) from local community members who have special knowledge of the candidate's abilities/accomplishments. All this must be sent in along with the Completed Entry Form.

Lastly is the Auxiliary Scholarship for Young **American Creative Patriotic Art** Awards. This patriotic art can be done on paper or canvas. Watercolors, pencil, pastels, charcoal, acrylic pen and ink or oil may be used. Digital art and photography are not accepted. Do not frame. Submit canvas entries on stretcher frames or canvas board. Other entries must be matted on white. Mounted and floating mats may also be used.

The art should be no smaller than 8" x 10" and no larger than 18" x 24" not including mat. A typed explanation of the patriotism expressed in the art must be attached along with the entry form to the back of the artwork.

Be sure to read all the rules on the entry form especially regarding the etiquette of the American Flag whether it is blowing in the wind or still. Your entry must be signed by your teacher or supervisory adult. Package your art so it can be mailed without being damaged or drop it off at VFW Post 392.

Each entry must be sponsored by the Auxiliary. Deadline for artwork to be at the Post Auxiliary is March 31, 2017.

NOTARY PUBLIC

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the Post for an appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)
- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he /she suspects

anything may be false or wrong.

General MacArthur Memorial Post No. 392
