Made your New Year's resolutions yet? I hope you resolve to live a healthy life style. An easy thing you can do is to make sure your shots are up to date. Flu,

Pneumonia, DPT, and Shingles are a few that you should have already. Exercise, eating right, and stopping smoking should be at the top of your list.

Every year the Post members raise thousands of dollars for the fight against cancer. However, we continue to maintain an unhealthy environment in the Post Canteen by allowing smoking inside the building. According to the Centers for Disease Control, in adults who have never smoked, secondhand smoke can cause heart disease and/or lung cancer.

For nonsmokers, breathing secondhand smoke has immediate harmful effects on the cardiovascular system that can increase the risk for heart attack. Nonsmokers who are exposed to secondhand smoke increase their heart disease risk by 25-30%. Secondhand smoke exposure causes an estimated 46,000 heart disease deaths annually among adult nonsmokers in the United States. Lung cancer risk is increased by 20-30%. Secondhand smoke exposure causes an estimated 3,400 lung cancer deaths annually among adult nonsmokers in the United States.

According to the CDC, Eliminating smoking in indoor spaces is the only way to fully protect nonsmokers from secondhand smoke exposure. Separating smokers from nonsmokers, cleaning the air, and ventilating buildings does not eliminate secondhand smoke exposure.

We've raised a lot of money in the fight against cancer, maybe it is time to take the next step and eliminate smoking in the Post. I hope you will consider doing your part to make our Post Canteen a healthier place to visit. Best wishes for a healthy New Year .

CANCER DANCE

Please mark your 2014 calendars, our next annual fund raiser will be the Cancer Dance in April! There is always a planned social, music and entertainment, and of course plenty of room to dance! With every dollar we give, and every volunteer hour we sacrifice ... we take another step closer to celebrating less cancer and more birthdays!

CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Cervical cancer is a major concern for many women. Screening programs have done much to put minds at ease over recent years, but just how much do you know about Cervical Cancer? These Q&A are designed to get you basic facts

What is cervical cancer?

The cervix is a ring of muscle at the entrance to the womb. The surface of the cervix facing toward the bottom is covered with a type of skin which can become cancerous.

What are the symptoms?

It is unusual for women to experience the symptoms as the majority of cases are diagnosed during screening. But symptoms can be abnormal bleeding and discomfort during intercourse.

What is cervical screening?

Your doctor will take a smear from the surface of the cervix by using a small wooden or plastic spatula. It is painless.

A number of cells from the cervix stick to the spatula. These are examined under the microscope for any abnormalities.

All women over the age of 20 should be screened every 5 years. Each year, over 40,000 women are found, thru screening, to have advanced stages of this disease.

How effective is the treatment?

The treatment is very effective. Three out of every five patients will be cured. For women under 50, nearly four out of every five are cured.
