CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

WHY DOESN'T GOD LET ME WIN THE LOTTERY?

Q: I hear so many times what they would do with the money, if they could win the lottery! It sure would solve their financial problems, but so far they have won very little or nothing at all and actually they in the hole for the year.

A: Frankly, if you ask me a year from now I suspect they'll say almost exactly the same thing; statistically, very few people ever win the lottery the way you hope you will.

Gambling of any kind is not encouraged by the Bible - and one reason, I believe, is because gambling is almost always driven by greed. Instead of being disciplined and wise with our money, we gamble some away, hoping we'll end up getting more, without actually working for it.

But instead, we become like the people the prophet Haggai wrote about: "You earn wages, only to put them in a purse with holes in it" (Haggai 1:6).

Perhaps God hasn't let you win because He knows this isn't how you need to overcome your financial problems. Instead, He wants you to use your money wisely. Make a realistic budget - and stick to it. If you need help, ask Him to guide you to someone you can trust who understand financial matters.

Don't' trust some "get rich quick" scheme to solve your financial problems. Wouldn't you be better off if you'd saved the money you've gambled away and applied it instead to your debts?

The Bible wisely says, "Whoever gathers money little by little makes it grow" (Proverbs 13:11).

The most important thing you can do, however, is to put your life into Christ's hands and trust Him with your future—including your finances. God loves you and even in hard times His love never fails.

NOTARY PUBLIC

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

- Bob Duvall
- Joseph G. Brady

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the Post for an appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)
- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he / she suspects anything may be false or wrong.


