My goal is to serve you to the best of my abilities, while promoting teamwork and camaraderie across our organization. Reiterating what Comrade Commander Steve Williams called upon all of us to do, and that was a message encouraging us to bring health concerned Veterans to the Post for help.

The recent census reflected that over 60k retired Veterans reside in the Hampton Roads area and I would like to encourage you to continue building Veterans' outreach relationships in our community. Veterans' organizations, such as the VFW, often serve as an integral catalyst to providing information and connections to networks for Vets with health/welfare concerns.

As a testament to the unyielding devotion of many of our VFW/LAUX member's outstanding contributions, I am pleased to announce that Post 392 received the William T. Allen Hospital Award for Hospital services provided in 2013-2014.

Veterans Administration healthcare update: The U.S. House of Representatives unanimously approved legislation on June 10th, 2014 to certain Veterans experiencing long medical appointment wait times to seek care at non-VA facilities. In a nutshell, this proposal would permit Veterans to use non-VA medical facilities, and would put an end to VA staff bonuses for two years. A similar proposal has been introduced into the Senate legislation as well.

There will be a Virginia Beach Health and Fitness Expo held at the Virginia Beach Convention Center from August 29-30, 2014. This international exposition will showcase modern advances in the health, fitness and sports sectors. It will also offer seminars, technology and sporting displays, along with many relating items being offered for purchase.

Finally, the work that you have been performing for our Vets in need is truly remarkable and has made tremendous positive impacts throughout our community. Thank you all for your service and continued commitments to our fellow Veterans. As your new incoming Post Surgeon, I can tell you that this is going to be an exciting year ahead, and that I am truly looking forward to working with all of you.

CANCER AID AND RESEARCH

JULY: UV SAFETY MONTH

During the summer, everyone wants to enjoy the sunshine and warm weather. Not only does the sunshine improve our mood, many people want to get that healthy, tanned look to their skin. But the sun's rays can also be harmful, which is why we have a national safety month centered around UV safety and it so happens that the American Cancer Society designated July 2013 as UV safety month.

You may have heard of the two kinds of ultraviolet radiation that reach the earth's surface, UAV and UVB, but you may not be sure which type is harmful. The answer is - they BOTH are.

Too much UV radiation can cause skin cancer, cataracts and other eye conditions, as well as immune system suppression. So during UV safety month, consider these practice:

- Use sunscreen to avert sunburn: Five or more sunburns can double your chance of getting skin cancer, so use a sunscreen with a high SPF number and cover ever inch of exposed skin.
- Limit your time in the sunshine: Yes, a healthy glow looks great, but it won't be so wonderful when your skin ages prematurely. Over-exposure to sunlight causes wrinkling and increases your chance of melanoma.

- Get in the shade: Whenever you can, get out of the direct rays of the sun, whether it's under an umbrella, an awning or just going inside for a while. The sun is at its most intense at noon and in the early afternoon.
- Stay hydrated: It's all too easy to overlook your body's need for water, but it's important to stay hydrated in the heat, when fatigue can quickly catch up to you.
- When you're in bright light, wear sunglasses with UV protection, as it will help protect your eyes from the damaging effects of UV radiation.
- Use care when you're near water or snow, as those surfaces will reflect UV rays against you more intensely than you realize
- Watch the UV index: It's there to help you gauge your risk and whether you should even be in the sun at all.

Why it may seem a bit odd to have a national safety month devoted specifically to ultraviolet radiation, the recommendations above hopefully demonstrate to you the benefit of UV Safety Month is to drawing attention to the risks of ultraviolet radiation.
