# You THINK YOU HAVE Nothing To Confess?

**Q:** We know we're supposed to confess our sins when we pray, and ask for God's forgiveness. But we feel we are very moral, and to be honest, usually can't think of anything to confess. But we ask ourselves, what are we missing?

A: Be thankful for your honesty, as well as your willingness to admit you may be missing something ... which you are. The Bible says, "if we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us" (1John 1:8).

What is it about sin that you don't understand? Let me suggest two things. First, you don't understand sin's depth. Sin is like a deadly disease that touches everything we do and everywhere we are. Yes, you may be a good and moral person whose life isn't marred by obvious sin. But what about your inner thoughts and motives? What about your pride? What about the things you should be doing but fail to do; the people you ought to help, the person who needs a kind word, the person you ought to be praying for but don't?

Second, you don't understand sin's cost. Sin is so serious that is cost God's own Son, Jesus Christ, His very life. God takes sin that seriously, shouldn't we as well?

The Bible says, "this is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down His life for us" (1John 3:16).

Suggested Reading: Proverbs 28:13 and Psalm 32:1-5.

## HOW HONEST CAN WE BE WITH GOD?

Q: How honest can we be with God? We don't want Him to get upset with us, but to be honest we can get kind of angry at God because He doesn't seem to be doing anything about a particular problem.

A: Let me assure you that we can be absolutely honest with God. After all, He already knows what's going on in our hearts and minds. So why shouldn't we express out true thoughts and feelings to Him? As the Bible says, "Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight" (Hebrews 4:13).

But listen, God also wants to be honest with us! Yes we can dumb all our negative thoughts and feelings on Him, and He won't get angry with us for doing so. But God also wants to help us overcome them. And He will help, if we only seek His wisdom and strength. Sadly, some people get angry or upset with God, and are content to stay that way. But when they do, they miss the blessing and hope God has in store for them.

I think often of Job in the Old Testament. He couldn't understand why God let him go through so much suffering. And he bluntly let God know his feelings. But he also humbly sought God's will, and eventually he realized there was a divine purpose behind his suffering, even if he couldn't fully understand it. Job declared, "Though he slay me, yet will I hope in him" (Job 13:15).

We should begin our prayer with committing ourselves to Jesus Christ, then ask God to help you to deal with your problems (perhaps revealed with wise advise from others). The Bible says, "in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight" (Proverbs 3:6).

# **NOTARY PUBLIC**

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

- Bob Duvall
- Joseph G. Brady

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the Post for an appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)
- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he /she suspects anything may be false or wrong.

# SUMMER SAFETY: Treating Heat Illness

(excerpts from 'Summer Environment / Hot Weather' DCCS at Madigan Army Medical Center)

A number of heat illnesses exist including:

<u>Heat stroke</u> - Defined by a body temperature of greater than  $105.1^{\circ}$ F (40.6 °C) due to environmental heat exposure with lack of thermoregulation.

Symptoms include dry red skin, rapid / strong pulse, no sweating, and dizziness or unconsciousness.

<u>Heat exhaustion</u> - Can be a precursor of heatstroke.

Symptoms include pale skin, heavy sweating, rapid breathing, nausea, confusion, and a fast, weak pulse.

Other heat related illnesses include Heat syncope (fainting as a result of overheating), Heat cramps (muscle pains that happen during heavy exercise in hot weather), Heat rash (skin irritation from excessive sweating), and Heat tetany (usually results from short periods of stress in intense heat. Symptoms may include hyperventilation, respiratory problems, numbness or tingling, or muscle spasms).

### **Treatment Tips:**

Be prepared for treatment by keeping an 'Iced sheets' available. They can be easily equipped for use by taking a large cooler and fill it with ice and water. Place dry sheets in a zip-lock bag inside the cooler and have the cooler available when the environment is conducive to heat illness.

If a heat illness victim is conscious, assessing their state of mind will give some insight to the extent of the illness. A good way is to assess for confusion by asking four simple questions: What is your name? What month/ year is it? Where are you? What activity were you doing when you became ill?

If the victim is unable to answer these questions, or suddenly develops unusual behavior such as combativeness, slurred speech, the next steps are to cool and evacuate.

Cooling is the most important life saving intervention you can provide.

- First, place the victim in the shade or air conditioning. The skin may feel hot and may be dry or sweaty.
- Remove as much headgear and outer uniform as possible.
- Remove the iced sheets from the cooler, drench them in the ice water, and place them over all the victim's exposed skin (resoak the sheets in cold water and reapply if they start to warm)
- Call emergency medical services to evacuate the victim.
- Continue to cool until the victim begins to shiver or until the ambulance arrives.
- Do not try to evacuate the victim yourself focus on cooling. If a victim loses consciousness, check their breathing and pulse and initiate CPR if required.
