In the Dept. of VA news, Veterans now have the ability to track the status of most of their prescriptions online, thanks to an innovative idea by a Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) employee. The new 24/7 service allows online tracking for most prescriptions mailed from the VA Mail Order Pharmacy. This innovative tracking feature will also include images of the medication that has dispensed and later this year, they plan to launch a secure messaging feature that will alert Veterans when a medication was placed in the mail.

CANCER DANCE

Please mark your 2015 calendars, our next annual fund raiser will be the Cancer Dance in April! There is always a planned social, music and entertainment, and of course plenty of room to dance!

With every dollar we give, and every volunteer hour we sacrifice ... we take another step closer to celebrating less cancer and more birthdays!

MARCH: COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Colorectal cancer is cancer of the colon or rectum. It's as common in women as it is in men. Last year, over 143,360 people will be diagnosed with colorectal cancer and an estimated 51,690 will die of the disease. With certain types of screening, this cancer can be prevented by removing polyps (grape-like growths on the wall of the intestine) before they become cancerous. Risk Factors:

- Age 50 and older
- People who smoke
- People who are overweight or aren't physically active
- People who drink alcohol in excess, especially men
- People who eat a lot of red or processed meat
- People with personal or family histories of colorectal cancer, benign colorectal polyps, or inflammatory bowel disease (such as ulcerative colitis or Crohn's disease).

Symptoms:

Early stages of colorectal cancer don't usually have symptoms. Later on, people may have these symptoms:

- Bleeding from the rectum or blood in or on the stool
- Change in bowel habits or stools that are more narrow than usual
- General problems in the abdomen such as bloating, fullness, or cramps
- Diarrhea, constipation or a feeling that the bowel movement isn't quite complete
- Weight loss for no apparent reason
- Vomiting

Early Detection:

If you're at average risk for colorectal cancer, start getting screened at age 50. If you're at higher risk, you may need to start regular screening at an earlier age and be screened more often. If you're older than 75, ask your doctor if you should continue to be screened. Early detection = more successfully treatment.

Treatment:

Surgery is the most common treatment. When the cancer has spread, chemotherapy or radiation may also be given.

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the VFW main office for appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the

notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport, validated by INS.
- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he / she suspects anything may be false or wrong.
