Comrades and Sisters, our Members have been busy supporting our Veterans through our active hospital programs and individual assistance to veterans and their families.

During the month of August, twenty-two VFW/LAUX, and Cooties, participated in four projects that benefited 64 VA Hospital patients and Veterans in need of assistance. These volunteers travelled a combined total of 617 miles at their own expense, with a valuation of over \$86 in time and service to Vets in need.

In the news, Wounded Warrior Project® (WWP) has just released the results of their 2014 Annual Alumni Survey. It's an interesting read and the responses collected were from over 21,000 wounded Veterans.

"When our nation's injured Veterans speak to us, we must listen," said Steve Nardizzi, CEO of Wounded Warrior Project. "Our survey data tells us where our warriors continue to struggle, allowing us to improve and strengthen our programs, and identify gaps in existing services and support. OCTOBER: BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month - a time to promote regular mammograms and increase early detection of breast cancer when there is the best chance for treatment.

About 1 in 8 women in the United States will get breast cancer. Other than skin cancer, breast cancer is the most common kind of cancer in women.

So please, take it seriously. If you are age 40 to 49, talk with your doctor about when to start getting mammograms and how often you need them. At the age of 50 and up, mammogram are every 2 years. Talk with a doctor to decide if you need one more often.

These are significant numbers that with some focus on retention, we can use toward our membership goals, and potentially 'All State' and 'All American' awards.


As the Senior Vice, Doug Iles,
