As a Tricare member, you have access to comprehensive prescription drug coverage and several options for filling your prescriptions. I find the most convenient to be the Tricare Pharmacy Home Delivery. This is your least expensive option when not using a Military Treatment Facility. With home delivery you don't have to wait in long lines at the Dispensary and you get your medication delivered right to your mailbox with free delivery. If you take medications on a regular basis vou should check into this. You may receive up to a 90 day supply of medications for minimal out-ofpocket costs. CANCER AID AND RESEARCH

SEPTEMBER: PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS

Prostate cancer is a disease in which malignant (cancer) cells form in the tissues of the prostate. It is about the size of a walnut and surrounds the urethra (the tube that empties urine from the bladder).

This year approximately 217,730 men will learn they have prostate cancer and more than 32,050 men will die from the disease. African-A m e r i c a n m e n a r e disproportionately affected by prostate cancer, having higher rates of prostate cancer diagnosis and death than men of all other ethnic groups.

The American Cancer Society

recommends that men have the opportunity to make an informed decision with their health care provider about screening for prostate cancer.

Men at average risk should start talking to their doctors beginning at age 50. Men at higher risk, should talk to their doctor about prostate testing earlier, including African Americans, at age 45, and men who've had a firstdegree relative diagnosed with prostate cancer, at age 40.
