CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

OLD PEOPLE GET LONELY

As I get a little older now and having a conversations, with someone at the Post, I have found gender has no boundaries; the worst part of getting older is the loneliness. Also the loss of a loved one (Spouse) passed away, and none of our children live nearby, they have own family to take care of. Also, when or (if) you go to church, almost no one talks to you; the younger generation seems to avoid you or not even care. But maybe you can encourage people to pay more attention to those who are older.

I certainly can sympathize with your concerns. As friends or loved ones pass away and our health limits our contact with others, it's easy to feel isolated and lonely. We even may be tempted to say with the psalmist, "No one is concerned for me ... no one cares for my life" (Psalm 142:4)

But it doesn't need to be this way! For one thing, we can reach

out to others and make new friends. I also mention that almost no one speaks to at church, but what's to prevent you from taking the initiative and speaking to them? Some may be just as lonely as you, and even a few words of friendship will encourage them and cheer their day.

Ask God to make you a blessing to others. But the most important thing I can tell you is that we are never alone when we know Christ. God loves you just as much now as He did when you were born, He is with you every moment of the day. God's promise is true: "Even to your old age and gray hairs; I am he, I am he who will sustain you" (Isaiah 46:4)

WHY ARE SOME PEOPLE SO THOUGHTLESS?

At our August meeting our Service Officer Joe Brady, spoke up mentioning visiting our Comrades while they in the Hospital to brighten up their lives. I must concur with Comrade Brady. And it really saddens me to see the way some of our Comrades never hear from families or never have fellow Comrades visit them in the time of need. It's almost as if their families just wanted to get rid of them. Why are people so thoughtless?

Over the past six (6) years as your Post Chaplain, I've visited countless local hospitals and nursing homes that our Comrades have been in and without exception, the staff has asked me to stop and greet some of their proservice members who never had a visitor. I was always glad to do so, of course, but (like you), it also saddened me greatly.

The Bible says "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure

and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress" (James 1:27).

What is the problem? The problem isn't just practical (such as living too far away or not having enough time). The basic problem is spiritual and moral, because we put ourselves before others, and before God. Never forget: Self-love is the greatest enemy of true love! The Bible warns of the time when "People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, and abusive...without love," (2 Timothy 3:2-3).

Someone once said to me, that the reason he never visited his mother in her nursing home was because she wouldn't remember he'd been there. But even if that were true, he still would have brought her comfort for a few hours, and he also would have been able to check on her care. The Bible says, "Honor your father and your Mother" (Exodus 20:12).

Ask God to make you a blessing to those you serve—encouraging them, helping them, cheering them, loving them, praying for them, Remember Jesus' words: "In everything, do to others what you would have them do to you" (Matthew 7:12)

SEPTEMBER: PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS

Prostate cancer is a disease in which malignant (cancer) cells form in the tissues of the prostate. It is about the size of a walnut and surrounds the urethra (the tube that empties urine from the bladder).

This year approximately 217,730 men will learn they have prostate cancer and more than 32,050 men will die from the disease. African-A merican men are disproportionately affected by prostate cancer, having higher rates of prostate cancer diagnosis than men of all other ethnic groups.

The American Cancer Society recommends that men have the opportunity to make an informed decision with their health care provider about screening for prostate cancer.

Men at average risk should start talking to their doctors beginning at age 50. Men at higher risk, should talk to their doctor about prostate testing earlier, including African Americans, at age 45, and men who've had a first-degree relative diagnosed with prostate cancer, at age 40.

The American Cancer Society offers a 24-hour toll-free hotline at 1-800-227-2345 that provides information and a support network 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

NOTARY PUBLIC

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

- Bob Duvall
- Joseph G. Brady

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the Post for an appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)

- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he / she suspects anything may be false or wrong.
