NOTARY PUBLIC

The following Post members are commissioned as Notary Public's in the Commonwealth of Virginia:

They are authorized to legally notarize documents such as Power of Attorney, Bill of Sale, Will, Living Will, etc. Please check with the Post for an appointment.

Be aware that under VA code the notary must acknowledge:

- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities. Under the law the notary has the right to refuse, if he /she suspects anything may be false or wrong.

VFW SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

VFW offers scholarships for Students (Middle School and High School), Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen, Teacher's Awards, Patriotic Art (High School), and Scout of the Year.

Voice of Democracy is a typewritten essay and then dictated onto a CD or Flash drive. It is open to all high school students throughout the state. But if you live in Virginia Beach, your essay should be sent to a local Virginia Beach Post. The same with students who live in Norfolk, their essays go to a local Norfolk Post.

As with all the scholarship programs through the VFW, there are several levels of winning. As long as you are in first place with the local Post, you will then move up to the District Level. The upward progression then goes to Department and finally National.

The National Prize for Voice of Democracy is \$30,000.00 and includes a trip to Washington DC with one parent or guardian. Each winning level will have an award. The deadline for the local Post entries is November 1, 2016.

Patriot's Pen is an essay for middle School students, 6th through 8th grades. The 300-400 word essay is titled, 'The America I Believe In.' It must be typewritten and then submitted to the local VFW Post.

The top National prize is \$5,000.00, and also with a trip to Washington DC with a parent or guardian. In order to get to National, as above, you must stay in first place through the levels. There are 54 levels of winning in the National Division with prizes ranging from \$5,000.00 down to

\$500.00 at 54th place.

Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award is for a Teacher who possesses that special skill and dedication to the students. This teacher shows innovative teaching and resource development methods. The winning teachers will be selected from groups K-5, 6-8, and 9-12.

A teacher may be nominated by another teacher, a parent, a principal, or a couple of students. The only person not able to nominate a teacher is a self-nominee or relative of the teacher. The person nominating a teacher must fill out the brochure and write a 350 word essay on why they feel this nominee should be selected.

We recommend that when you nominate a teacher, it is a good idea to give the teacher a copy of the brochure so they will be able to gather the information that will be needed. These items are a one-page resume, up to five pages of documentation of their teaching experience (references, news articles, etc.) and a head-and-shoulder photo of themselves.

The deadline for this Scholarship Award is February 15, 2017 and should be sent to the local VFW Post. The National prize is \$1,000.00 for the teacher and \$1,000.00 for the school.

The Young American Creative Patriotic Art Awards is a program sponsored by the VFW Auxiliary. This scholarship is open to students in grades 9-12 who are in High School art classes. The instructions are very specific and should be read carefully. No digital or photographic art is accepted. A short typed explanation of the patriotism expressed in the art must be included with the entry brochure. (please note - when drawing an

American flag, follow the Federal Flag Code).

National prizes include \$10,000 for first place, \$5,000 for second place, \$2,500 for third place, \$1,500 for fourth place, and \$500 for fifth through eighth place.

As with all other entries for any VFW scholarship - entries are sent to the local Post. Deadline to the local VFW Auxiliary is March 31, 2017.

Scout of the Year Program is open to anyone who makes the following awards this year: Eagle Scout, Girl Scout Gold Award, Venture Summit Award recipients and/or Sea Scout Quartermasters who have risen above their peers.

Applicants must be registered in their troop, be at least 15 years of age, demonstrated exemplary Citizenship in school, Scouting, and community. The brochure explains all of the documentation necessary to be submitted.

The top prize for National is \$5,000 for first place, \$3,000 for second place, and \$1,000 for third place. The deadline again to the local Post is March 1, 2017.
