- Signer must personally appear before the notary
- Signer is positively identified
- Signer must affirm under oath the accuracy of the document.

Acceptable Forms of Identification:

To be acceptable, the ID must be one of the following and current:

- Driver's license or State issued ID card
- U.S. Passport
- Foreign Passport (INS validated)
- Driver's license issued in Mexico or Canada
- U.S. Military ID Card.

We do not rely on Social Security cards or photo ID cards issued by non government entities.

SCHOLARSHIP NEWS 2019-2020

Here it is September and the first part of the VFW Scholarship programs will be coming to the deadline on October 31, 2019.

Voice of Democracy, Patriots Pen and Smart/Maher VFW Teacher Award are the first three due in October. As a recap, Voice of Democracy is for grades 9-12, open to all students, public schools, private schools and homeschooled. Voice of Democracy is an essay on "What Makes America Great". It is a typewritten essay and then dictated onto a CD or USB drive. The dictation must be within 3-5 minutes (+/or - 5 seconds max.).

Patriots Pen Essay is also titled "What Makes America Great". It is for students in Middle School, grades 6-8. The essay must be between 300-400 words (+/or - 5 words max.) The Essay title and any footnotes do not add to the word count.

Smart/Maher VFW Teacher Award is open for nomination for Teachers from K-5, 6-8 and 9-12. Anyone can nominate a teacher with the exception of a relative of the teacher. It requires a short essay about the teacher (350 words) written by the person nominating the teacher. A principal, another teacher, parents of a student and also students may nominate a teacher. If a teacher is nominated, please make sure to give them a copy of the brochure so they will know what type of information will be needed from them if selected. This information is located on the brochure under 'How are teachers nominated', second paragraph.

Later on the following Scholarships are due: Scout of the

Year has a deadline for March 1, 2020 for any Scout receiving their Eagle Award, Girl Scout Gold Award, Sea Scout Quartermaster Award or Venture Summit Award.

The last Scholarship is the Young American Creative Patriotic Art Award with a deadline of March 31, 2020. This is a 2-dimensional or 3-dimensional art. The brochure explains all the details for each. Please be sure to read them carefully
