# CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Happy April Comrades, Auxiliary & friends. I greet you in the Blessed name of Jesus Christ our Lord & Savior.

This year April brings with it one of Christianity's most important celebrations, Easter. The day that Christians believe that, after Christ had died for the forgiveness of our sins, He arose from death.

With the world in so much Christians. turmoil between Hebrews & Muslims, surely there must a great bit of difference in their beliefs! Surprisingly, they are extremely similar. The basic Bible Hebrew (the Old which the Testament), upon Christian Bible is based, is also that which the Quran is based. Many of the same characters are mentioned in each.

The initial split came about when Arabs living in in current day Saudi Arabia, thought that the Jews living in Saudia Arabia were straying too far from the teachings of Abraham & Moses. As the Muslim Religion developed, though few, there were some important differences between the

two great religions. Muslims viewed Muhammad as a prophet, while the Jews thought a prophet had to be of the "Chosen People" (Hebrew). The very term "Chosen People" was an afront to the Muslims.

As we fast forward a few centuries, with the prophesied birth of Jesus, both religions recognized Jesus as a prophet. the most However. one of differences important between Islam & Christianity is how each view Jesus. While Islam views Jesus only as a prophet, Christians view Him as a prophet, the divine Son of God, the Messiah & God incarnate. Muslims believe Muhammad was the final prophet, as stated above Christians do not recognize him as a prophet. Christians believe in salvation through faith in Jesus Christ. Muslims believe in salvation though submission to God & following the teaching of Islam. Realizing that both, over the years, have been radicalized through interpretation & personal motivation. these the are significant main differences.

What are the many things that the basic religions have in common? 1) Belief in one God (Allah in Islam, God in Christianity) Both believe in prophets (messengers of God) including Abaham, Moses & Jesus. 3) Jesus was a prophet, who performed miracles & sent to guide the people. 4) Emphasize the importance of ethical behavior, compassion & justice. Importance of submitting to God's will. 6) Both trace their lineage back to Abraham. 7) Each have sacred text believed to be divinely inspired: the Quran in Islam & the Bible in Christianity. 8) Both ascribe to peace.

With all the similarities, one must wonder what must God/Allah think of all of the lives lost trying to force one another to believe what "I believe"?

Dear God, we pray for a time that people will accept one another in peace no matter what their beliefs. AMEN
