CONTINUING EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

Each year, the VFW Auxiliary gives out four scholarships to assist auxiliary members and their immediate family members who wish to further their education by pursuing a college degree or career direction at a vocational/technical school.

Four \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded each year, one in each of the four VFW Auxiliary Conferences.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the American college or vocational/technical school of the awardee's choice.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Applicant must be 18 years of age or older.
 - Applicant must be one of the following:
 - Current VFW Auxiliary Member*
 - Spouse of the current VFW Auxiliary Member*
 - Son/Daughter of current VFW Auxiliary Member*
- *Qualifying member must have

been a member of the VFW Auxiliary for one (1) year by the application submission deadline.

HOW TO ENTER:

Go to www.vfwauxiliary.org, click on Scholarships & Contests, click on Continuing Education where you can download the application form.

- Answer all questions on the application form.
- Write a brief essay (no more than 300 words) describing your commitment to your goals and how this scholarship will help you attain those goals.

WHERE TO FILE:

The application is to be filed with the VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters direct. You can either email it or send by postal mail. The email/ mailing address can be found on the application.

WHEN TO FILE:

The application process opened July 2022 and will continue until February 15, 2023, the deadline date for submission.
