## SENIOR VICE COMMANDER

Fellow Brother and Sisters,

As a reminder, the VA has released the following notification regarding Veterans in crisis in need of immediate treatment. Please share this with family and friends that are or have veteran members, as this is a huge step towards Veteran suicide

prevention. From VA: the "Starting Jan. 17, Veterans in acute suicidal crisis will be able to go to any VA or non-VA health care facility for emergency health care at no cost - including inpatient or crisis residential care for up to 30 days and outpatient care for up to 90 days. Veterans do not need to be enrolled in the VA system to use this benefit." This is a huge change and should be shared as much as possible, as we do what we can to reduce the number of Veterans suicides. ## <u>Updating Your Name, Address</u> <u>and Contact Information</u>

VFW Post 392 maintains the name, address, phone number and email address for all our Post and Auxiliary members. If any of this information has changed for you since you joined the Post, please notify the Post Quartermaster (vfw392@gmail.com), & Adjutant (webmaster@vfw392.org) so we can update our databases. If you are planning on moving anytime in the upcoming future (often the case with our active duty military members) please contact us as soon as you have your new contact information so we can stay in touch with you and ensure you get Post information.

When your mailing address changes, be sure to fill out a USPS address change form, mail it in, or drop it off at the Post. **DECEASED MEMBERS:** Please contact the Post when a member is deceased. When members are only reported as deceased to VFW

National, we find this out only by checking the National Deceased list, which does not provide the deceased's date of death. Also, VFW National Headquarters often lists members from our Post as deceased without us knowing. Sometimes these members have been deceased for many years. When we find out that a member is deceased, often the members contact information is not up-to-date, we are unable do a follow-up with the family.

Annually VFW National does a search for deceased **VFW** members. They sometimes report members as deceased that are still alive. This is a main reason to keep your contact information upto-date. Last year, VFW National report 31 of our members deceased. I've been unsuccessful in finding the deceased date for 9 them as their contact information is out-of-date.

We try to maintain a permanent wall plaque for the names and dates of our deceased members. Please help..


